Dr. Basil Hetzel has been at the forefront of the global campaign to overcome iodine deficiency and its associated mental impairment, firmly establishing the causal role of iodine deficiency in brain damage to newborns. To honor his leadership, the International Council for the Control of Iodine Deficiency annually honors the person making the most significant public reportage of iodine deficiency disorders and the necessity of sustainable national programs.

Nicholas D. Kristof of the New York Times is the inaugural winner of the Basil Hetzel Award. Mr. Kristof has displayed an unerring understanding of the crucial role of micronutrients and of iodized salt in sustaining adequate iodine nutrition. His stories from South Asia and West Africa have universal application, enormous power and compelling character. Like Dr. Basil Hetzel, Mr. Kristof has seen an important problem, taken time to understand the problem and its causes, and projected himself in leadership to make the world a better place for us all.
